# CHILD PROECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS

**Know the Warning Signs of a Predator:** Perpetrators are not waiting on the street to snatch kids; only 10% of sexually abused children are abused by strangers. 90% are abused by someone known and trusted by the child/ child's family. Perpetrators integrate themselves into everyone's life, not just the child. They build relationships so that they are trusted to be alone with the child. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with a child in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows a child to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. ### A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

My mind is blown that this is our final 'Green Vestment Sunday' till after the Christmas Season! Next week we will commemorate the Solemnity of Christ, the King of the Universe, and then the following week (after Thanksgiving – how is it almost Thanksgiving?!) we enter the holy season of Advent! The year is swiftly coming to an end, and our readings at Masses over these past few weeks and the few weeks we have remaining before Advent keeps making us take our gaze off the world and onto Calvary, to the Heavenly and Eternal Jerusalem, where we are all destined and sojourning together. As we near the season of Advent, just a few informational items for your planning.

From Dec 1 – Dec 23, I will offer daily confessions, Monday to Saturday. I will get you a calendar next week, but each day of the week will have its own time. Fr Ray has accepted the offer to take a Monday time slot so there can be daily confessions in Dec, even while I am off on Mondays. Fr Ray will be helping with Saturday afternoon confessions, as well, so we can get through twice the number of confessions on Saturdays during Advent. I'll let you know, as well, the times of the penance services throughout the deanery if you wish to go to one of those throughout the Advent season. As your pastor and your spiritual father, I just have a conviction that it is my duty and honor to make myself available to you to hear your confessions over the Advent, and Lenten, seasons. Simply relegating my pastoral care to a penance service is not a bad thing, but I am simply just not wired that way! Again, I will give an Advent calendar of all that next week.

Next week, I will also be able to give you the Christmas Mass schedule. I want to run the Mass times past parish council and the music ministry beforehand, but with deadlines, I can't do all that before the bulletin is due for the week. With the other Mass times needing to be ironed out, I can say, though, that one Mass time with no wrinkles to be ironed out is Midnight Mass! Midnight Mass is my favorite Mass of the year, and I will be celebrating this year - and all my years I am with you - a traditional 12:00 AM Christmas Mass! If you have never been to a Midnight Mass, plan on it, for there is nothing quite like the experience of celebrating our Lord's Incarnation at the stroke of Midnight in church for a beautiful Liturgy! So, next week, be on the lookout for Advent Confession times, as well as the Christmas Mass Schedule. (I can't believe we are talking about this already!)

I'm writing this the evening of election night, and I admit, as much as I loathe the drama and performance of cable news and the pageantry behind all of it, I do enjoy election night coverage and watching those tallies come in. Since I don't have a television, I subscribe to a free trial of a streaming service that gives me news stations and stream that for the evening. What I really enjoy about election night is that, after every other day of the year, we are made subject to the manufactured drama and outrage that our news media creates for us to ingest, they are forced for us to tell them a narrative, our story! It's a night to remember that even though those with cameras and studios and nine-figure budgets might have the loudest and most obnoxious means to make noise, the people have the loudest voices! Because it is my nature, I tend to see something vibrantly spiritual about that – about our program of governance and the power we hand over to the individual ordinary citizen! I know many create nationalism or Americanism into some bizarre religion, but what I see as coming from God is the freedom and autonomy we give each citizen. This freedom and autonomy from anyone or anything is something that is truly the ideal of our human existence. We are not created for enslavement to anything or anyone. Even from God Himself, He does not enslave us to His cosmic might – we have total and utter freedom to accept and reject any or all of it! This idea of freedom speaks to something that I have come to see and believe in both the realm of people's faith and their politics: you cannot force or wrestle anyone into a belief or a position. You can inform and teach, not force love or belief in anything. This is why Our Father gives us that unmatched freedom – He can't force our love and devotion towards Him, He can't. If He does, it's not love, it's coercion. If we want to see people build lives of faith and participate in the building of the Kingdom of God, in addition to the building of the City of God here on earth and vote and fight for various ideas and convictions, then we can't force it, we can only make it attractive and live them out ourselves. If I want you to vote a certain way on an issue, I can tell you facts and what the Church says on the issue, but none of that exchange will *make* you do anything, your heart must be in love and convicted on the issue or idea or belief! We must be people of unmatched joy and love, of passion and zeal. That is what attracts people to God, the faith, the Church, and a moral way of living and casting a vote. The world has enough noise and chaos and radicalness – let us offer it something simple and beautiful, something that brings peace, joy, hope, and love to their hearts and homes. That is the City of God and the Heavenly and Eternal Jerusalem we are all seeking and sojourning towards.


