### A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

One of the things that I have come to appreciate about our faith over the years is just exactly what faith is and what it is not. I think that too much in our world and culture – especially in this post-Christian era we live within –defines faith cheaply and haphazardly. We all have gone through the period of our lives where the belief in God is likened to being fearful of a man in the sky with flowing white facial hair and furled eyes. This period of faith is also one where we tend to treat God as a cosmic Santa who isn't just checking his list to see who will be visited on Christmas, but who will escape the fiery clutches of damnation and be given an eternal prize for being found on the Nice List! This is the age when we also think of God as a blob of being –the Holy Trinity's distinctions and unities are too vague for our minds at this point, so we sort of make a slushie out of Trinitarian Theology and just think of it all as 'God'. Jesus is, well, God, but He's man, too, but...it's easier to just put all of it into a blender and just say God – but don't forget to give Him white locks and facial hair, because He's God and that's what God has...! We all must start somewhere, and this is how most begin the journey with God and begin forming a penetrating knowledge and union with Him. There's nothing evil about it, it just is what it is -a place to start, not land. The problem is that an alarmingly high number of us remain here, and when we remain here, we turn into one of two things: apathetic and milquetoast Christians at best or terrified scrupulous slaves to a furled-faced man in the clouds at worst. The one thing each of these has in common is that they define faith the same way. Their experience of God is remarkably different, but they define what it means to have faith the same way: believing what you can't see or prove because that is what you were taught or told to do. When I look out at the Church at large and attempt to peer into the reasons behind the decline in people who say they believe or practice their faith, the one thing I keep seeing and concluding is that far too many were ill-formed in what it is to have faith! They simply were! The Church, for a season, I think, got very comfortable and was riding the coattails of high attendance and bustling parishes, and took for granted that people still needed to be fed by God! And when attendance started to decline, the natural strategy was to try and appeal to young people - which is a fine strategy and they meant well, except too many in the church thought young people were dumb and needed faith dumbed down! We can push our kids to excel in athletics, learn second and third languages, master mathematics and sciences, play complex pieces of music on incredibly challenging instruments, interpret and compose literature, and even conquer incredibly challenging video games – but when it comes to God, they need to make lame felt banners at pizza parties while some middle-aged person attempted to be cool and relevant!

The proposition that God is too hard or too far beyond what our children and young adults are capable of is condescending and ironic because most of the people that peddle that lie are the ones obeying a cosmic Santa! If you doubt this, then where are those kids of the 80s and 90s? The majority aren't with us on Sundays. I'm not just speaking as a pastor, but as a 36-year-old who grieves that most of my peers are not living a life investing in the Lord and the Kingdom and His Church and their Faith. I get it, not all are called to be priests – though many more are or could have been if they had not been fed to crafts when they were hungering for Truth. All, regardless of age, are created to discover what faith truly is. What is faith? It's an encounter that begins with a desire. All people, old or young, rich or poor, educated or flunk out, have a desire within them to touch eternity, to behold the cause of all creation, and to unite themselves with, not some ridiculous Santa in the sky, but Trinitarian Love and the essence of being itself! Yes, it's big stuff and hard to comprehend, but that's the point! It is something that will continue to draw us and call us and beckon us for the entirety of our lives! It doesn't matter your age or if you have a degree in something – no one cares – what matters is that we honor that desire for the Living God in one another and do all we can to help them experience the rush of the Spirit when peering insights are discovered and unions are made. May we never do a disservice to our young people and tell them they are too dumb or too young to know God. The Blessed Mother, The Little Flower, Dominic Savio, Maria Goretti, Carlo Acutis, Giorgio Frassati, Chiara Bodano, Kateri, Francisco and Jacinta, and so on – were they foolish for having deep faith in their youth? Were they mere pariahs? No! They were allowed to run wild with their innate desire for the God who created them and saved them – and they found Him! That is Faith! May we work together here to make that a reality for all of us!




