

Please make sure you attend the time that you sign up or get a sub so we do not have empty hours. I want to express my immense gratitude for making last weekend's Installation Mass so beautiful and impactful to me (and my family – they loved it and love you, too)! I hadn't gone through one when I was made pastor of St Francis, so I had no prior experience and didn't know what it would be like, so I was just experiencing it live with you. I had only read the text of the dialogue in an email I received that week I was on retreat. It was moving to see so many there, and it's been meaningful to have had many reach out and let me know they weren't going to be there but wished they could. Again, it means the world to me! The reception was *phenomenal*, and I am so grateful to those that organized that and made it all happen! I can honestly say my only role in that was eating! Our choir and music were simply *beautiful*, too! I had asked them to sing some of my favorite hymns, and they're hymns I've used over the years for many meaningful Masses – it was important to have those sung that evening at that Mass for it was especially meaningful to me. Thank you for all your love and passion!

This weekend, I am away. I had planned it a year ago, not knowing what a crazy time it'd be leading up to it, but it makes the time away even more restful! I'm not the best at getting my vacation time in - I haven't been away for a weekend in over a year, and canon law gives us permission for three a year. I am grateful to Fr Ray for manning the ship!

What invariably gets tangled in the minds and hearts of so many is the struggle for living an authentic Christian life and entering deeply into a contemplative relationship with the Lord of Lords and God of Gods who created and died out of a tremendous love for us. There is a struggle to move beyond the God who demands things and actions out of me, and into the embrace of a God who simply loves me and desires me for who I am. As I said in last week's bulletin, this is the paradox we need to move beyond: He wants us to do good, but He doesn't want the good works, He wants us! To many, this sounds like a frustrating and cute manufactured conundrum, or simply malarky! Clearly, if I do not do good works, then I jeopardize heaven, and yet, if I do those good works, it doesn't necessarily mean I'll get to heaven! It is like that fallacy I presented in a homily this past summer (to be honest, I remember talking about it, but I have absolutely no idea what week or what readings that was! I don't write those things down).

There is a fallacy in Logic that goes like this: If *A*, *B*; *B*, therefore *A*. This is a logical fallacy. For instance: If it rains and I'm outside, I get wet; I'm wet, therefore I was outside when it rained. No, I could have fallen in the Shenango or just taken a shower. Just because I'm wet doesn't mean I was outside in the rain, but, when I am outside in the rain, I will be wet. Follow?! Another – If I have no fuel in my truck, my truck won't start; my truck won't start, therefore I don't have any fuel. Again, not necessarily. My battery or alternator could be dead, or a million other nuanced mechanical and electrical issues could cause the truck to not start, not just the absence of fuel. This is where it's time to employ this fallacy with our spiritual conundrum – or, as I see it, a phenomenally magnificent invitation into the life of God! So: *If I do good works, I'll be saved; I did good works, therefore I will be saved.* Well, again, not necessarily! Just read that line a few times, it sort of even sounds wrong, doesn't it?

Much along the theme of last week's Scripture, we come to Zacchaeus in this week's Gospel, a man aimless and lost, deep in the throes of earthly life and sin. When our Lord approaches him and calls his name, it's Zacchaeus He calls, not 'tax collector' nor 'dirty sinner' nor 'filthy man'. No! Our Lord looked and saw Zacchaeus because it is Zacchaeus He desires. Now, for Zacchaeus to remain in His presence and to delve deep into the mystical Truths of that intimacy, he'll need to let go of those lies the enemy has told him for years, and cling to the newfound Truths his new loves, Jesus & The Father, will reveal to him! Zacchaeus needs conversion and to do good, but those are simply external signs of something far deeper he needs to do – flee the enemy! Zacchaeus needs to run towards the embrace of the One who desires him, not who lies to him. Those works and actions of a good charitable and moral life are expressions of saying "No" to the enemy, Satan, and his demons who desire only our demise. Those external actions have a requisite interior component of escaping the lies and diving into the Truth. Remember we are seen and called by name as beloved children, don't earn it, simply express it in the way you love and live your life. This is the simplest and surest way to assure eternal life and excel in your spiritual life! (Ugh, I always run out of space! See you on All Saints!)
