

<u>A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON</u>

I'll be heading up to Mundelein, IL Sunday afternoon after Masses. This will be my fifth time up there doing this program, and my second time doing my annual retreat with them; I have four trips, and one retreat, remaining over the next 15 months. I have come to fall in love with this immersion in Ignatian Spiritual Direction and am so grateful each time I go that Bishop allowed me to do this. I feel such a need to get there this time, especially with it being a retreat! With so much change that has happened in my life over the last four months – all remarkable and awesome change, mind you – I am simply hungry for just a few days to go into silence and just be with the Lord.

As I said, this will be my second time doing my retreat through this spiritual direction program (each Oct of the program is a retreat, and the other times are practicums and lectures). Prior to this program, I'd go to a monastery for a week and just be in the stillness of the Lord. A highlight retreat was going to Christ in the Desert Monastery in New Mexico. That was the most remote place I think I've ever been to. You fly into Albuquerque and drive something like three hours into the desert. It was remarkable! Each night I sat outside and when you looked up, it was one of those skies where you can see the brilliance of the Milky Way and make out every detail of every light in the sky! I have never seen any-thing like that before or since. On that retreat I read Dark Night of the Soul by John of the Cross – the setting was apropos for that spiritual classic! Aside from the desert that year, most of my retreats have been at The Monastery of Bethlehem in Livingston Manor, NY, which is about two hours NE of Scranton, deep in the Adirondacks. The sisters there are contemplative, cloistered, and Carthusians who live a Byzantine spirituality. It is heaven on earth! Retreat guests stay in individual cottages high up on a hill overlooking a lake, nestled in the crook of the mountains. It's silent, reverent, contemplative, and all I need! I hope to get back up there sometime soon, even if for only a few days, for it does my soul good!

Anyway, I could write forever about those retreat experiences. Each retreat has offered something unexpected and delicately beautiful for me to take and treasure. This year I go as a priest who has become a Father to a new family whom I have been given the privilege of falling in love with. I can't wait to take my priestly heart into the mystery and awe of retreat!

One thing I'll take with me when I travel will be a little notebook that I keep in a wallet with my passport that goes with me whenever I fly or travel a great distance; it's in my backpack that goes everywhere with me. I use it as a travel log that I've kept for years. All I do is record the origin and destination of each individual flight I've taken, as well as each state and country I've been to. The first flight I ever took was from Cleveland to Houston on Continental Airlines for a high school Robotics competition in Apr '04. Since then, I've just recorded everything. To date, I have taken 75 flights, and have been in 25 states and 9 countries. I am grateful to have been taken on two pilgrimages that were free; I have opened and closed many airline credit cards to get lucrative sign-up bonuses; I used to when living in Clearfield, fly out of the DuBois Airport to visit friends in both DC and Pittsburgh! Seriously, you could pay \$40 and take a flight on a 10-passenger plane and be in either DC or Pittsburgh within 90 min! Just have your friend pick you up and you flew cheaper than what gas would cost! Pre-covid, I'd aim to go on an annual vacation that involved some significant travel with priest friends, so those numbers recorded have grown steadily over the years. So many of those travels I have written down have some of the most fun and crazy memories attached to them! I could tell you about the time I was flying to Tel Aviv when I was hauled into an interrogation room at the Newark Airport by Israeli security and escorted onto the plane by armed military personnel. I could tell you about a flight being delayed and since I had to get home, I was seconds from accepting a 6-hour drive from a total stranger at 2 AM because he was going my way! I could tell the story of taking a train through the Swiss Alps and sharing a compartment with someone who talked about how he was going to Paris to mediate talks between the French Government and UFOs! So many tales and memories!

I say all that because for me, memories of travel are some of my most cherished and I seek to grow those memories with family and friends as often as I can and as the opportunities present themselves. Memories are important because they not only tether us to the past but also remind us that, when they are good, we are loved and that there are people in our lives that do love us and want to spend time with us. This is something important to remember in the spiritual life, too. We can't be people who every time we go to prayer re-introduce ourselves to God or forget all the good that God has and has been doing within us. Whenever we go on retreat or go to prayer, we present ourselves as people with memories, stories, battle scars, and love that has shaped us and brought us to where we are. As we desire to grow our faith and intensify it, it can't happen by forgetting our past and what God has done for us! May we be people who remember and cherishes all God has done so that we can catalog all the memories of how good God is and how awesome the Love around us from family, friends, and God has been all our lives!
