

Worship Me Only. Whatever occupies your mind the most becomes your god. Worries, if indulged, develop into idols. Anxiety gains a life of its own, parasitically infesting your mind. Break free from this bondage by affirming your trust in Me and refreshing yourself in My Presence. What goes on in your mind is invisible, undetectable to other people. But I read your thoughts continually, searching for evidence of trust in Me. I rejoice when your mind turns toward Me. Guard your thoughts diligently; good thought-choices will keep you close to Me.

Feelings are visitors of the heart. Welcome them. Each feeling comes to teach you something very specific. Be hospitable to these guests. They are only passing through.

Unless you ignore them. This detains them unnecessarily. You cannot get them to leave by ignoring them, avoiding them, or pretending they don't exist. They will stay until you attend to them. And when it comes time for them to leave, thank them for visiting.

At present I know partially; then I shall know fully. (1 Corinthians 13:12)

"God only knows!"

Befuddled, we say these words while rolling our eyes. Hurt, we mutter them through clenched teeth. Despairing, we whisper them with tears in our eyes. The truth is, life is full of mystery. There are some things that only God knows. We may understand them one day, but right now, we don't. We know in part – only God knows fully.

Our readings today remind us that God's ways are far beyond our understanding. Jeremiah knew that he was to be a prophet and understood God's word to the people of Israel at that time (Jeremiah 1:4). But he didn't know that centuries later, his prophecies would be fully realized in Jesus. He know only in part. Only God knows fully.

In our Gospel, Jesus chided the people in the synagogue for dismissing him as "the son of Joseph" (Luke 4:22). They had heard his remarkable teaching, but they couldn't get past the Jesus they had known for thirty years. They knew only in part. Only God knows fully.

Even St. Paul, whose understanding helped form the Scriptures, acknowledged, "At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known" (1 Corinthians 12:12). As much as Paul had learned about God, he know that it was only the smallest glimmer of God's goodness and glory. Like Paul, we see indistinctly, dimly, as in a mirror or a darkened room. Only God knows fully.

But God knows you fully, better than you know yourself! Even more, in his wisdom, he knows the plan for your life. He knows what you will face in the future, and he is pouring out grace to prepare you even now.

Life is a mystery. Some things you will only understand in heaven – and that is where faith comes in. Faith in the loving God who knows everything. And one day, he will reveal it all.

"Thank you, Lord, that I am fully known and fully loved."

Why is Life so messy?

It's a reasonable question. But it's worth asking whether we really want to know the answer. Perhaps we already know the answer, but we ask the question, hoping that maybe, somehow, the answer will be different.

Life is messy because I am messy. Any day now the world's human population will reach eight billion. We each have our own mess, and of course, if you add all those little messes together it becomes significant. This isn't necessarily good or bad. It isn't necessarily a problem. The problem occurs when we try to live as if it isn't so.

Paul the apostle observed, "The good that I would, I do not; and the evil that I would not, I do." What was he saying? We don't do what we say we will do. We don't do what we intend to do. And worse than that, we often do things we know are bad for us, things we know will hurt other people, things that we know we will regret. And we do all these things even though deep down we don't want to do them.

Life should be lived with maximum intentionality. But too often we are conflicted and confused. When we act in these states, we usually cause pain and suffering to ourselves and others. Clarity is necessary to live with great intentionality. But finding that clarity is almost impossible in the midst of this crazy, noisy, busy world. That's why having time in silence and solitude each day is essential.

Why is life messy? Life's messy because we are messy. But this is not the only reason. Life is messy for reasons that make sense, but it can also be messy in ways that can only be rightly defied as a mystery.

Life is also messy because it can be random and unpredictable. We don't like random and unpredictable. The illusion of control is one of the most powerful. The reality is that while we can influence a great many outcomes, we are not in control. Despite this indisputable reality, we waste so much energy laboring under the illusion, trying to control people, situations, and outcomes.

Life is messy, but it isn't just a mess. Life is also wonderful. But this is the perspective that departs us when we are in the thick of the mess. We lose sight of all the good and get consumed by the turmoil we are embroiled in. We are tempted at these times to think that life will never be good again. This is the perspective that steals away our hope. The whole truth is that life is messy, but it is also wonderful and beautiful and aweinspiring.

When I began scribbling in this notebook, I had lost this more complete perspective and trying desperately to recover it. I knew I was lost and that was a grace. But that was all I knew in those dark moments. I didn't know how to get unlost. So, I would write, in hopes that, consciously or unconsciously, I would scribble something down that would point the way toward a brighter future. Wherever you are in your life, I hope these words do the same for you.

Life is messy because we are messy. The way forward always requires that we take responsibility for our part in the mess.
